

The original house was built of rubble and was lime-washed. would have looked very white. It had about 10 acres of land. Bach and Parc Cuareli and the promontory and coastal slope.


The house became one at some stage in the late 1930s.



Moylgrove 1801-1961: Population profile



Tithe map 1847



The Ladds

- In 1881, Charles Ladd (Trewidwal, 1860-1933) married Hannah Davies (1855-1940, b Manorteifi, housemaid at Plas Pantsaeson)
 - Buried in St Andrew's graveyard
 - With Lizzie (6, b.1886) and Garfield (6, b.1896); and John (1894-1917)
 - John married Martha Rees in 1913; they lived in St Dogmaels. Killed in Battle of Arras.
- Mary Ann (b 1883), Emlyn (b 1885) and David (b 1889) were born in Patagonia
 - First Welsh settlements 1865. Hard going until ~1880.
 - Lizzie d.1892 in Moylgrove
- Last child was Phylis, b 1900, Moylegrove.
- Charles b 1860 Trewidwal, son of David & Mary Ann
- 1891, 1901 Living w family in Tegypistyll
- Moved to Trefaes Isaf before 1911.
